NHAS August 2016 Business Meeting

The August business meeting was held at the McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center, our President, John Bishop, presiding.

The New England Fall Astronomy Festival (NEFAF) is taking place Sept. 9-10 at UNH. Gary Duranko, our coordinator for the event, reports that the daytime sky watch is covered, but we still need volunteers for Saturday night. We need someone to conduct the laser pointer sky show on Friday. Bob Veilleux will be displaying meteors. Gary will present "What's Up in the Sky" Friday and Saturday. We need someone to give a presentation on NHAS on Saturday 1:00-1:25 PM. We need a booth/table person for our tent display on both days.


